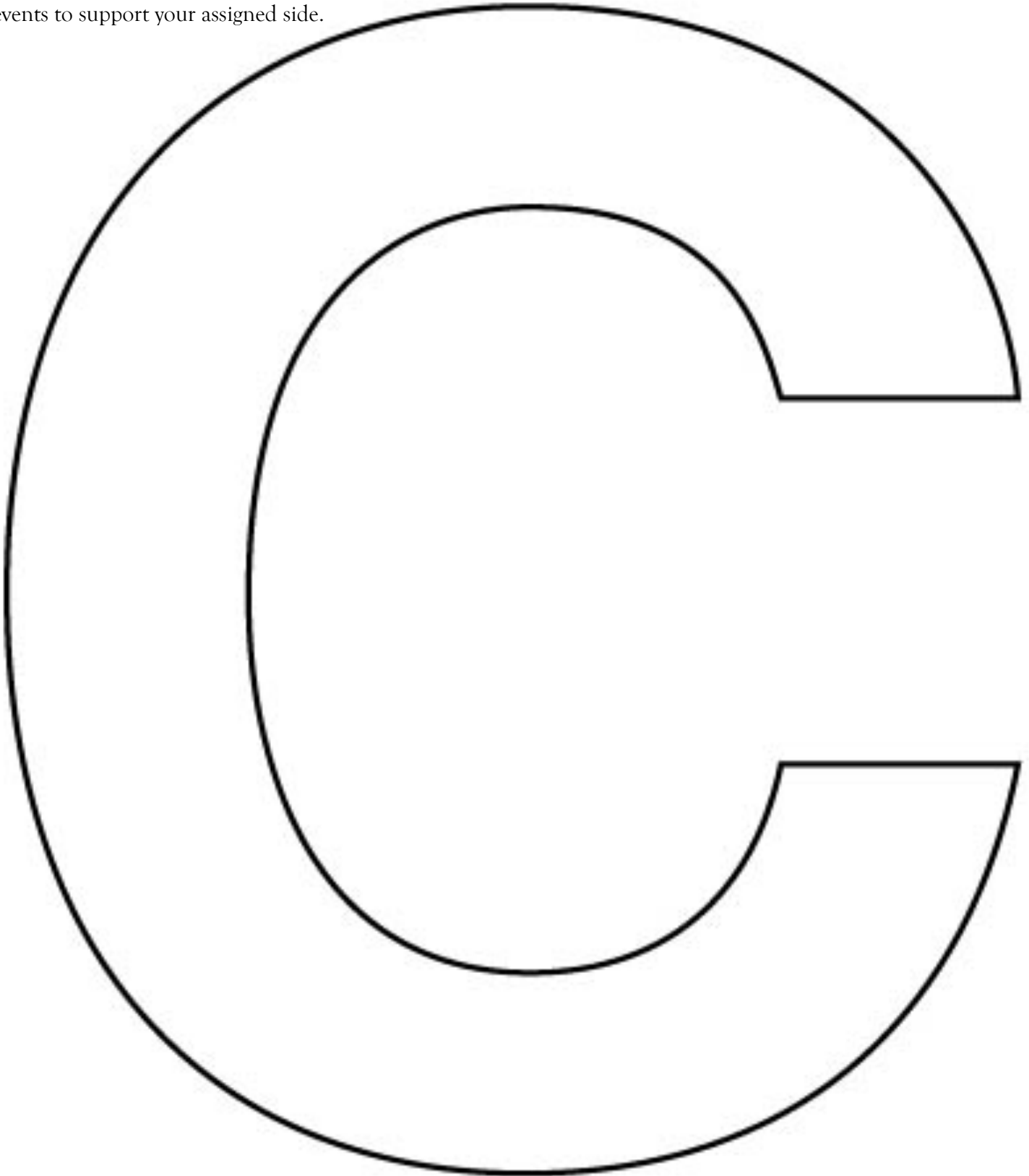


LESSON OBJECTIVE(S)

- 2.) **EXPLAIN** why capitalism, labor unions socialism and communism were appealing to the workers of the Industrial Rev.

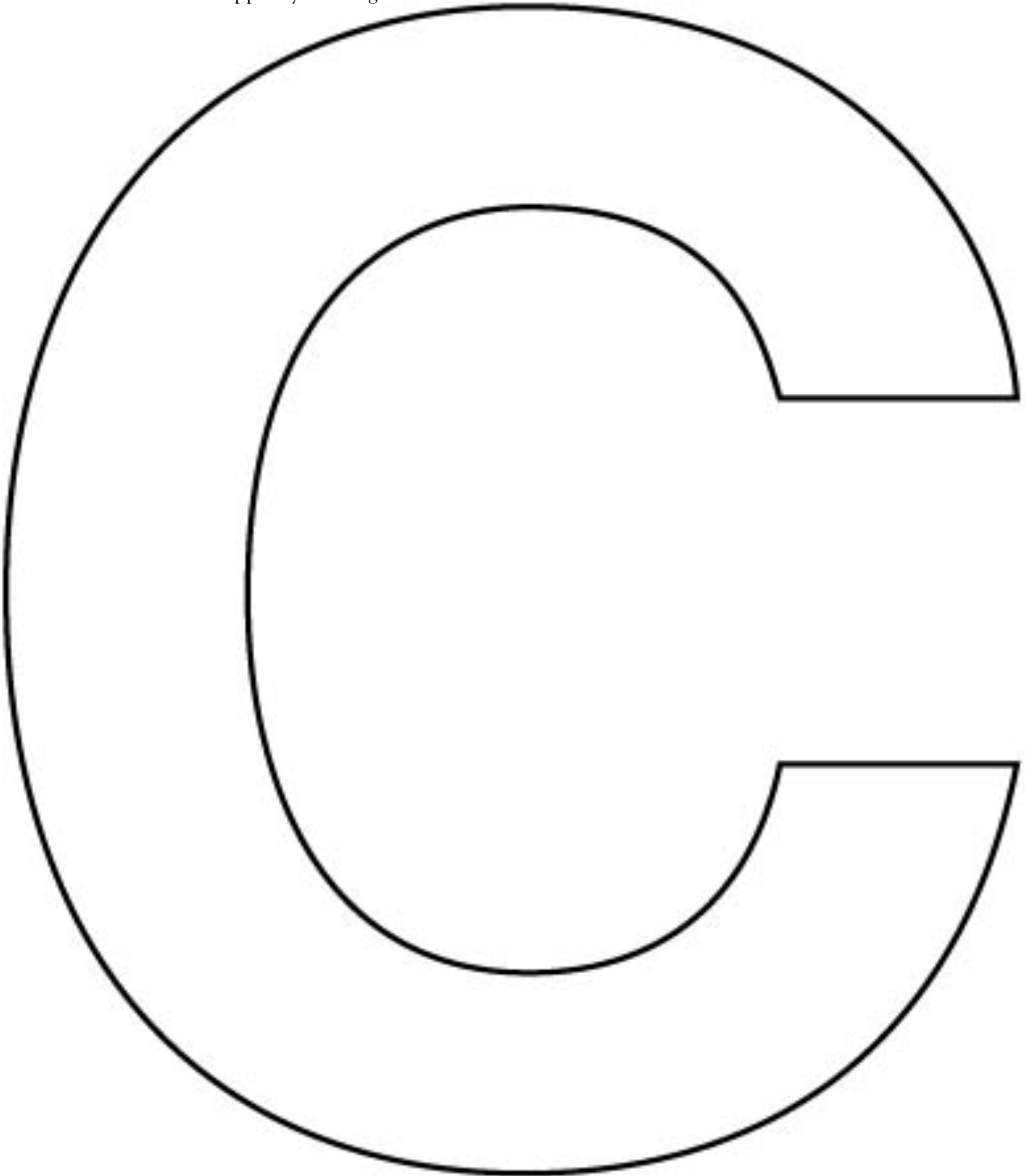
PART I: IS INDUSTRIALIZATION PROGRESS? A FORCE OF CREATION OR DESTRUCTION?

PART II: CREATE-A-CLAIM

DIRECTIONS: Taking into account BOTH the secondary source information AND the primary source information in support of each side, what do you think is THE MOST sensible claim? Working with your partner, grab a computer and create a well-worded, sensible claim in response to the following question:

Is industrialization the essence of progress in the 19th century?

(i.e. Is industrialization a force of creation or destruction in the 19th century?)
